



Beef Cattle Industry: Education Increasing Profitability

The UF/IFAS Beef Cattle Short Course (BCSC) and related programs address production management. profitability, and quality strategies of beef cattle. **Coordinated by the Department of Animal Sciences.** the 3-day BCSC event includes 12 hours of expert lectures and 4 hours of hands-on learning. **Participants range** from owners and managers of diversified corporate ranches to novice and hobby cattlemen, as well as UF/IFAS **Extension county** faculty.

The Beef Cattle Short Course is a UF/IFAS Department of Animal Sciences program including faculty programs from the Range Cattle REC (Ona) and North Florida REC (Marianna). On an annual basis, other departments also participate in the curriculum, including the College of Veterinary Medicine, Agronomy Department, Soil and Water Science Department, and Department of Wildlife Ecology and Conservation.
