TOP 10 NEEDS for Florida Residents by Population Density









The UF/IFAS Program Development and Evaluation Center recently surveyed Florida residents to determine which issues they saw as priorities for UF/IFAS Extension to focus its effort. Florida residents statewide identified well-paying jobs, affordable medical clinics, and affordable housing options as the assets most needed in their communities, as determined by measuring the gap between their satisfaction with the asset and its importance.

Identifying gaps allows UF/IFAS Extension to focus its efforts where they will have the most impact. Action is needed when people view an asset as important but are not satisfied with its availability in their community. Well-paying jobs were identified as the greatest need for suburban and downtown residents, while farm or rural residents reported affordable medical clinics as their greatest need.


Gaps between Perceptions of Community Asset Importance and Satisfaction According to **Statewide Residents.**
